10. President's Report

We had a very good retreat led by Father Estrella. By the way Father would like to do a Lenten Retreat. I will keep you updated on that. We had 20 and it would be nice to have 3 times that. On November 8th we sponsored the Camposenos program in Dixon hosted by Council's I7903 and 10378. We had 42 Knights from around the Chapter come and participate. At Dixon; they only had 2 and half months to prepare for this. It was scheduled for Colusa but they were unable to follow through. Much thanks to the two Councils. GK Jerry Castanon is here today. Thank you Brother. We feed the farmworkers so that they can feed us. We had not only had food but clothes and jackets. Thanks to Brother George for spearheading this. It was a well run operation. Things like team work and fraternity that occurred that day make me very honored and proud to be the Chapter President. We have had many State officers and Past State Deputies come from this Chapter. That's why we are "SUPERIOR"
I would like to recognize two of them that do so many great things for our Chapter. Brother Dave Abbott is not here. . How many PSD's show up each month and humbly and quietly prepare our

Audio visual needs. He's not the kind of guy that says "I did my thing as State Deputy; I'm done". No, he's committed to this chapter's success. And there is another person: he's in the room. Percy Park.

For close to 20 years now, he has run the Soccer and Basketball Freethrow contest and somehow has always kept it under the budget. Recently, his wife has been ill and yet he has not refused to help us. Also, I must recognize our Communications Director Brother Dan D'Innocenti. He quickly keeps us updated from the messages he receives from the Councils and Committees. And, I am always trying to improve. Brother Dan is from the Travis AFB Council. I believe that we are doing well with membership. You will hear more from our Membership Director Bill Wagner. I'm hoping that by the end of December we will be at our goal of 50% or better. I know that the councils are working very hard. We have 2 districts that are already over 100%; Districts 11 and 16. John Slamkowski and Marcel Camaya are to be commended.

11. Treasurer's Report

Bill Wagner said: There is a copy of the report on your chair. So in addition to seeing it on the screen you can follow the report on paper. Since the last Chapter meeting we ended up on November 15 at \$33,451. However, I wanted to note that there was a call for restricted funds, \$2590 of for the Uganda Ultrasound Project and \$4489 for Campesenos and with that the Unrestricted balance would be \$23,372. Further, looking at the landscape version it shows how we stand compared to the budget. I'm waiting for 4 Councils to pay the \$110 dues so that we will be in line with the projected dues. I received 3 today; so we are doing well there. We are doing well on the Opportunity Drawing whose proceeds will go to the Missionaries of Charity at the end of the Columbian year. Camposenos was a pass through and the President sometimes goes over his discretionary funds so we have to slap his hands on that. However if you look at the unrestricted balance of \$26,000 and the remaining Chapter expenses that are budgeted that have not been, that would bring us back to a balance of around \$18,000 at the end of the year which is where we typically end up. I have asked the Chapter officers if we could implement a small change to the banking **arrangements**.

I would like to have a separate bank account set up for the restricted funds outside of the budget. The bank will do this at no charge to the Chapter. I would like to take \$10,000 and buy to CD's; one for 4 months and the other 7 months.

12. Committee Reports

Audio Visual/Website ...CP said "Chair Brother Tremain Hayhoe and I did a walkthrough at the St. Patrick's Academy in Sacramento. We are determining whether we can support it. We did interviews, a walk through of the campus with the principal. Tremain put together a little couple minute trailer to give you an idea. This will all go on the youtube channel. **(The program was seen on screen)**. We showed you this so that you will see how these schools are a wonderful way to bring kids and families to Catholicism. They need our help. Bishop Soto started this school. They were getting \$800,000 originally and now \$500,000. It's getting less and less. The Diocese cannot afford it anymore. We need to save this school. Concerning our YouTube account; Tremain is only charging us \$200 a month. We are asking Council to sponsor an event for \$200 and Brother Tremain will feature some cool event that you have had. The name of the youtube channel is NorCal Knights.

The CP suggested that if you sponsor an event for \$200 to cover the cost for the youtube; that you invite us to come to support your charity. A good example is if you are working at Habitat for Humanity or Feeding the Athletes etc., we'll come and record the event. Question from Brother Peter Tremblay. "If we have a video that we have done; can you put it on youtube.?" Answer, "yes, just upload it on google drive Hayhoestudios@gmail.com and we can put it together.

Faith Chair: Brother Marco Ferrero reported: We will be doing a four series message during Advent. I would like to share a quick prayer with you Father, all powerful God. Your eternal word took place on our earth when the Virgin Mary placed your life at the service of your plan. Lift our minds as Knights of Columbus in watchful hope to hark to the voice which announces His glory. And open our minds to receive the Spirit which prepares us for His coming. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen"

EFF Chair: Deacon Dan Patterson reported: It is a Cor Program. There are some materials on the table to take and review.

Thus far, we have met with Bishop Soto and he is very supportive of our efforts to grow the Knights in faith and continue to form them.

I've been in touch with Ed Dantes our State EFF Director and he is communicating through the Chapter Presidents down to the Councils. He is asking that every council have a Faith Formation coordinator and he is asking for their contact information. So we need to get this out as soon as possible.

I will say this about COR. **Paraphrasing** "It is a really important word that defines this Faith Formation program. It has to do with our heart and if we think about sacred scripture. God does not see the person He sees the heart. That's where our love for God rests. We have a responsibility to form ourselves. For an example; If we do not use the talents that God has given us, they can dry up. So we are constantly forming and reforming our faith. As a Knight, supposedly a man of faith, we need this reformation so that the three other pillars Charity, Unity and Fraternity can flow. The love for Christ drives those other pillars.

We have been asked to take on the challenge of developing a place in our parish for all men where they can come together and journey to grow in faith and love of God. So, I ask you to take this back to your Council and parish. My email is Daniel@hs-sacramento.org."

Membership Director- Brother Bill Wagner reported: Our goal for membership this year was a round number of 600. We now stand at 171. We want to be close to 300 by the end of December. There are 31 councils in the Chapter who have not recruited even one member. There are only 18 Councils in this Chapter that our Safe Environment compliant with Supreme. We have roughly 57 chapters that run the risk of not doing this training. We ask that your officers do the Supreme training and all of your members do the Diocesan training.

New Council Development: Brother John Slamkowski reported: I want to compliment DD Will Friesen for restarting St. Robert's. Unfortunately, last night Father Victor, pastor of St. Philamen says he would wait until next year to start a council. The Vietnamese Martyr's Parish is also on our radar.

Chapter Retention: PCP Brother Frank Donagher reported: One of the GK questions for this meeting was about retention. We had a good session earlier today. The bottom line is "keep in touch with your members". Especially the older members. Contact is so important. Emails, phone calls and even visits don't always work.

Soccer Kick & Basketball Freethrow: Brother Percy Park reported. Just finished our Chapter level completion for the Soccer Kick. We have winners from all of the age levels(10). Hopefully, they we all attend the State Level Competition at Arroyo Grande. That is 4 to 5 hours from here and they want to start the Competition at 8:30 in the morning. For Freethrow, An email was sent out to show the different jurisdiction times for January, February and March. Any questions? Contact me on the Chapter website or ccontact me somehow. Recognizing District 9 which sent 12 candidates to the Chapter level and 4 moved to the State level.

ID Drive CP reported a message from Brother Dan Tatum reporting that no Councils have reported as of yet. We encourage all Councils to participate by June 2026. *** All councils will receive the full amount back from the money submitted. There is no longer a 7 ½ % service charge from the Frank Nigro Foundation..** Please use the new forms found on the their website Columbia-foundation.idcouncilforms.htm. There is a new address POBox366 , Fontana, CA

Special Olympics- Nor Cal & State Chair- Brother Charles Beltz reported “ This past weekend we sponsored a clay shoot in So Cal. It was a fund raiser for the So Cal Special Olympics. It takes a lot of cooperation with the law enforcement authorities to put these on. Hopefully, next year we will have one in Nor Cal to raise money for the Special Olympics here. It raises about 15 to 20 K. There are drive forms on the table. There is a line designated for a dollar amount or a percentage of your funds that you have raised from the “tootsie Roll” or different fundraisers that you can specify “Special Olympics”. Per athlete; It costs about \$4.50 for their meal. Instead of \$14. Plus their are brother Knights doing the cooking.

The next upcoming event is the last Saturday in March; which is the 28th. Unfortunately, for us it is the same day as our Chapter meeting. It will be at Chico State. It is a basketball regional and we will be preparing between 500 to 700 lunches. After that one is the Spring games coming up in May. This one will require a lot of lunches; probably 1400 lunches. This will be at Vista del Lago on May 9th.”

Vocations- Chair Brother George Bagley reported “ I received a copy of a letter addressed to the Pastors from our Diocese. It notifies them that if they wish to send Christmas Cards to the Seminarians they can send them to the Diocese Vocations Office by December 10th and they will be distributed to them before they brake for the holidays on December 15. I have sent this letter to our Communications Director. You should see it very soon.

This segways into RSVP. How many of you utilize the RSVP program in your Council? Well, looks like just about everyone here. The way that the Diocese Vocation Office asks Councils to sponsor a Seminarian is to first; contact them and they will select one for you. There can sometimes be a request for the same seminarian again and again. Thanks be to God; we have currently 13 Seminarians. At the Diocese they oversee who would be next in line to receive the sponsorship. This makes for an even playing field for all to receive an equal amount of funds.

Our 13th annual Vocations Benefit Dinner will be on n Saturday July 11th at St. Joseph's in Vacaville. Information for this will be distributed to the DD's at the next Chapter Meeting. The cost is projected to be \$500 per a table of 8. I am looking at a caterer right now, whom I believe will give us the same good meal at the same or less cost. Last year we raised \$20K at St. Joseph's Lincoln. Hosted by Council 9202.”

Campesino Event- Brother George reported “On November 8th at St. Peter’s in Dixon; 42 Knights from throughout the Chapter came to distribute food, clothing and toys to some 115 Campesino families from around the Dixon and Davis area. This event was hosted by Consejo Kefa 17903 and Dixon Council 10378. Brother Bagley proceeded to name the 42 members and volunteers from various parishes of the Diocese. (Names will again be made available from the Chapter Secretary at the next meeting.) The brothers, spouses, and volunteers worked so harmoniously. It’s like they have done this together many times before. Brother Deacon Dan mentioned also that “Angels in the Field” does a similar benefit for the Campesinos in the Central Valley.

Brother Bill Wagner mentioned an example of a Chrstmas Card idea. He said that Centennial Assembly sends Christmas Cards to the Seminarians and includes a \$25 Starbucks gift card.

- Suggestion concerning the Bishop’s Altar Server Recognition event. Right now, it lands twice a year in a particular district.

We need to find a way that the whole Chapter can be involved rather than on district.

Columbian Retirement Home- PSD Brother Ed Huestis reported The Columbian Retirement Home is one of 5 Corporations of the State Council. We will, today, have tours of the Home. The vision of the Home is to offer every Knight and spouse the dignity of suitable and secure affordable housing in their maturity, We will have tours during lunch. Brother Ed introduced PSD Brother Ross Willhour, the President of the Columbian Retirement home. And I am the Vice President of Finance for that corporation. Brother Ross reported “ Thanks to the NorCal Chapter for giving the most support of all the Chapters to the Retirement Home. It started over 70 years ago by a resolution at the State Convention. At the time there were about 30K members in the State and today we are over 70K. Back then, we could rely on the support of most councils in the state. And it has averaged about 100k over the years. However, in the past 10years that support has fallen off and now we have gone through most of our savings and our investments that offset this balance. It’s \$1600 a month and we should be charging at least \$2000 a month. Last year our net loss was about 45K. I am suggesting that if 100 Councils had an event for Seniors, which of course is a Life event, we could possibly raise that 100K. I know that NorCal will help us with a big chunk of the need”.

Brother Ed called up Brother Steve Nyser, Council 4907 Grand Knight to present a check to Brother Ross for \$1000. We hope that all of the Councils will give support.

Culture of Life: Brother Hayhoe reported Sacramento Life Center recently raised \$100,000

Poster Contest; State Chair Bob Pincshi spoke The State currently has 2 poster contests. The first is Supreme’s “Keep Christ in Christmas” and should be finished completely by the 31st of December. They should be sent to the Chapter representative Brother Peter Tremblay. There is a kit from Supreme that you can order. It is

called the CTC-kit . It can be ordered by your FS. Another way to get it is to go to the Family Programs at the Supreme website and download it yourself.

The second contest is the State Substance Abuse. This is entered by age categories. .This one goes by age. Two categories

8-11 and 12-14. You either choose alcohol abuse or drug abuse. The timeline runs from September to January 31st. This should also be submitted to Brother Peter as well. We don't want runnerups on this one. Just the winner is submitted. For more information, go to the supreme or state website. Look under Community programs.

We want the kids early on in their lives to focus on why it is so important to stay away from drug and alcohol abuse. And to remember from an early age that the reason for the season is the birth of Our Lord Jesus.

Brother Peter Tremblay spoke about the Citizenship Essay. If you have started, it should be wrapping up by now. When you are finished, take just the winners and check with your District Deputy and have him run through them before he submits them to the Chapter and State. We need oversight to keep them manageable for the judges to review. The deadline for the Citizenship Contest to get to the Chapter is December 1st. There is also a Keep Christ in Christmas essay for 4th to 8th grades. Council has until January 30th, world with DD's and is due to the Chapter by February 15th and then the State will go through it and have it completed by the middle of March. Then the winners will be presented at the Convention in the middle of May. The last essay is the Stewardship which is also a State Program for the younger students. This one will start in the spring with the Council getting it completed by the end of the school year. Then to the Chapter and getting it on to the State during the Summer for judging and have the awards presented in the Fall when the school year starts.

Wheelchair Program: Chair Brother Louis Salvatore spoke; Back in 2018 when Brother Michael Jones was President, this Chapter raised \$126K. Since then we had a slow drift downward. I don't even think that we have donated up to \$100K. In the State we have done well. Around \$300K. And that's great for me as the State Chair. But not here. We have close to 8,000 brothers in the Chapter. Just by the sheer numbers; there is no reason why we can't sponsor two containers which is about \$84,000. It's very doable in this Chapter. At just a thousand dollars a Council at 75 Councils that \$75K. I can make it easy for you. Just invite me over to the Council to do this. We can do the video, which is the most effective way. We found that if you don't do the video you will cut in half the amount collected. The video reminds you of what you have seen and relate to it. The Texas style program is that they do the Sunday program and then follow up on the next Sunday. This year they will make around 1.5 million dollars. Or you can simply do a fundraiser dinner or put it in your budget for the upcoming Columbian year.

Columbian Retirement Home: CVP Charles Beltz spoke on behalf of Chair Elbert Holmes: Personal plea; Councils, please find room in your budget for an annual contribution to the home. For example, my Council here in Marysville donated some money plus a seven burner grill. Now they have a grill out on the patio. The purpose of this grill is for one council per month. That's 12 Councils a year to come over here and cook a meal for the residents. Our Council will keep the propane tank filled. And we will put you in touch with Cathy, the lady that runs the place. Their largest meal is lunch. So you will be cooking a lunch. This action can count as a Helping Hands Program.

Coats for Kids: Chair Brother James Hunt spoke: We are well into the time for coats. For those who wish to order new coats from the Knights. There are order forms on the table. The delivery time now is 3 days.

Father McGiveny Guild: Chair Brother Robert Miller spoke: It cost absolutely nothing to sign up and join the Guild. You'll receive a newsletter from the Guild. We need to promote and pray for the miracle that will eventually bring about Blessed McGiveny's Canonization to Sainthood.
